

# School Regulations

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## SCHOOL REGULATIONS

### 1. Bearer of the School

The SWISS SCHOOL IN SINGAPORE (SSiS) was founded in 1967 as a public company limited by guarantee. As an entity limited by guarantee without shareholding, SSiS is supported by the members. The members are made up of parents of SSiS and any Swiss citizen.

SSiS membership is mandatory for at least one parent of each student enrolled under the SSiS. Any Swiss citizen may also apply for membership pending the approval of the School Committee. All members are eligible to vote at the Annual General Meeting, where they appoint the School Committee of SSiS.

### 2. Structure of the School – Age Requirements

#### EC

Our Little Tots and Playgroup teachers are trained and qualified in Early Childhood Education. Our Playgroups are mixed age classes consist of Playgroup I and Playgroup II. Upon entering Kindergarten, the children start the compulsory Primary years. From Kindergarten onwards, a qualified teacher (fulfilling the criteria set by the Swiss Education Ministry) leads the class.

#### German Stream

Standard German is the language of tuition from Kindergarten to Primary 6. From Kindergarten to Primary 6, in between one fifth to one-third of the weekly lessons are taught in English. From Primary 5 onwards, two weekly French lessons are taught as the third language.

#### French Stream

Standard French is the language of tuition from Kindergarten to Primary 4, starting from August 2020, with several weekly lessons taught in English.

### **3. Admission to SSiS**

#### **3.1 Enrolment**

The application process for enrolment of a child in the SSiS is made by completing the official application form.

A registration fee shall be payable, upon submission of the official application form. This registration fee is non-refundable, even upon the withdrawal of the application.

In the case of a waiting list, an administration fee is applicable. The administration fee will form part of the registration fee. Upon confirmation, the balance of the registration fee is applicable.

Note: The administration fee is non-refundable and has no guarantee of placement of the students at the SSiS.

#### **Re-enrolment**

If a child left SSiS and return for re-enrolment within 365 days, the registration fee is waived. If the re-enrolment occurs after 365 days of departure, the full registration fee is applicable.

#### **3.2 Admission**

The SSiS admits students whose academic, personal, social, and emotional needs can be met by its programs and services, and who can be integrated into a mainstream classroom. In case of doubt, the school management can request an expert's report in order to assess the possibility to meet the needs of a child at the SSiS before the decision on admission. SSiS provides support for students with light learning, social and emotional difficulties.

The SSiS shall make decisions regarding:

- Initial grade placement
- Promotion from one grade to another
- Retention in a particular grade
- Continued attendance at SSiS is based upon academic, personal, social, and emotional aspects of a student's school record.

In accordance with the SSiS's rules and regulations, the SSiS reserves the right to dismiss from its programs and services if

- the student's best interests and needs cannot be met effectively by the SSiS's programmes and services.
- the student's behaviour is deemed to jeopardize the welfare of the school community.
- educationally significant information is withheld from the SSiS.
- school fees are not paid in accordance with SSiS's financial regulations.

Admission to the SSiS shall be provisional until all required documents have been received and evaluated by the Admissions Office of the SSiS. The admission of a child will be notified in writing by the Principal of the SSiS. Upon notification in writing, the registration fee for the respective grade shall be due and payable to the SSiS. The SSiS will subsequently send a bill for the applicable amount of school fees, which must be paid within 30 days of the date of the bill.

In the Primary section, Swiss citizens have a guaranteed space unless the student's best interest and needs cannot be met effectively by the SSiS's programmes and services. In the event that a class is full, a waiting list shall be opened. This will be handled on a first come first serve basis depending on the date when the official application form and the registration fee were received by the SSiS. Applicants of Swiss citizenship have priority.

### 3.3 German/French/English Support

The German, French and English languages are important at our school. Students with little German, French or/and English foundation will have to attend support lessons (from Primary 1 onwards).

If the SSiS deems that the support lessons are insufficient for the student, the SSiS will request the parents to arrange for additional support.

## 4. School Fees

The school fees will be billed in advance before the beginning of each semester. The school fees must be paid on or before the due date. Please refer to the Appendix for the amount of fees payable for each grade.

The School Committee of the SSiS is entitled to raise the fees at any time even during an academic year. Written notice will be given to parents of any proposed fee increase.

For students who enter or leave the school in the middle of a semester, a pro-rata payment of the fee shall be made as follows:

#### Applicable fees for join during the semester

Joining after the Autumn Holidays	80% of whole year school fee is applicable
Joining after the Christmas Holidays	60% of whole year school fee is applicable
Joining from Semester 2	50% of whole year school fee is applicable
Joining after the Spring Holidays	30% of whole year school fee is applicable

#### Applicable fees for withdrawal during the semester

Leaving in the Autumn Holidays	20% of whole year school fee is applicable
Leaving in the Christmas Holidays	40% of whole year school fee is applicable
Leaving end of Semester 1	50% of whole year school fee is applicable
Leaving in the Spring Holidays	70% of whole year school fee is applicable

The SSiS retains the right to charge 2% on late payment from the date on which the school fees are due to the date of payment.

### 4.1 Building & Facility Fee

The SSiS has implemented the Building & Facility Fee. This fee enables the school to engage in improvement, renovation and other building projects whenever necessary. The Building & Facility fee will help to realize a healthy growth plan regarding the school's infrastructure and to maintain a big asset of ours.

The Building & Facility Fee will be billed together with the school fee in advance before the beginning of each semester.

Similar to the school fee, for students who enter or leave the school in the middle of a semester, a pro-rata payment of the fee shall be made according to point 4, school fees.

## 4.2 Withdrawal from School

The SSiS must be informed in writing of a student's withdrawal from the school. During the school year, SSiS needs to be informed no later than 3 months prior to the last day of attendance.

Failure to give adequate notice to the SSiS of a student's withdrawal shall result in a payment of 50% of the school fees for the following semester to be due and payable to the SSiS immediately.

### Withdrawal deadlines for students leaving end of Semester

- For students leaving end of 1<sup>st</sup> Semester 31 October 2021
- For students leaving end of 2<sup>nd</sup> Semester 30 April 2022

## 5. Teaching Materials

Consumable products (including but not limited to exercise books) will be given to the student at no extra charge.

Non-consumable products (including but not limited to textbooks) are provided for the benefit of the student and they must be returned to the SSiS in good condition. The parents shall be liable for any damage or loss caused to any of such non-consumable products by their children

SSiS has the right to charge an overall amount for frequent loss or damage of any consumable and non-consumable products.

## 6. Transport

The SSiS has appointed *D'Best Bus Transport Services* as its designated school bus transport provider.

## 7. Homework

All Primary students beginning in Primary 1 shall be assigned homework. The purpose is to consolidate and reinforce what has been taught during classes. Homework should be done carefully and promptly.

## 8. Absence from School

### 8.1 Little Tots, Playgroup I and Playgroup II

To maintain a regular attendance for classes at the SSiS and in the best interest of the child, absences should only be taken in exceptional cases.

For any planned absence(s) from classes, parents must give written notice to the respective class teacher and receptionist at least 7 days prior to the requested date of absence.

## 8.2 Primary (including Kindergarten)

To maintain a regular attendance for classes at the SSiS and in the best interest of the child, absences should only be taken in exceptional cases.

### Joker Days

Each student will be granted 3 days of absence per academic year (aka “Joker Days”). No reasons need to be provided and there are no restrictions on the date of absence. Students and parents are responsible for making up any homework that had been assigned during the period of absence.

For any planned absence from classes within the granted 3 joker days, parents must give written notice to the respective class teachers and receptionist at least 7 days prior to the requested date of absence.

### Beyond Joker Days

For absences beyond these 3 days per academic year (point 8.2) a well-justified request is required for the Principal’s approval at least 7 days prior to the requested date of absence.

Students and parents are responsible for making up any homework that has been assigned during the period of absence.

## 9. Regulations on Admission, School Reports and Promotion

Decisions on new admissions are made by the Principal of the SSiS (point 3.2). Exceptions to these regulations may be granted by the Principal of the SSiS. We may handle it differently in the French stream for children who are heading into the French system afterwards.

### 9.1 Admission to Little Tots

If there are vacancies, new applicants of Little Tots age, being no less than 2 years old may join the Little Tots class at any time during the academic year. All Children have the option of attending two, three or five days a week.

Once the class is full, new applicants will be placed on a waiting list for the Little Tots class. Applicants of Swiss citizenship shall have priority. As soon as an additional space is available, applicants on the waiting list will be notified in writing.

### 9.2 Promotion from Little Tots to Playgroup I

Children who have reached the age of three by 31 August will enter the Playgroup I class at the beginning of the following academic year.

### 9.3 Admission to Playgroup I and Playgroup II (mixed-age Playgroups)

If there are vacancies in our mixed-age Playgroups, new applicants of Playgroup I and Playgroup II age may enter the Playgroup class immediately. Children who have reached the age of three by 31 August will enter the Playgroup I class. Children who have reached the age of four by 31 August will enter the Playgroup II class.

Once the class is full, new applicants will be placed on a waiting list for the Playgroup class. Applicants of Swiss citizenship have priority.

### 9.4 Promotion from Playgroup I to Playgroup II / French stream Kindergarten 1

Children who have reached the age of four years by 31 August will enter the Playgroup II class or French stream Kindergarten 1 at the beginning of the following academic year.



### **9.5 Promotion from Playgroup II/French stream Kindergarten 1 to German stream Kindergarten/French stream Kindergarten 2**

Children who have reached the age of five years by 31 August will enter German stream Kindergarten / French stream Kindergarten 2 at the beginning of the following academic year. The Swiss School in Singapore will not guarantee a place in the Primary Department for students enrolled in the Early Childhood Department. A space in the Primary Department at the Swiss School in Singapore is subject to availability and the student's competency in the German or French language.

### **9.6 Admission to Kindergarten**

If there are vacancies, new applicants of Kindergarten age (of no less than 5 years of age) will enter Kindergarten directly. If there are no vacancies in Kindergarten, new applicants will be placed on a Kindergarten waiting list. Applicants of Swiss citizenship have priority.

### **9.7 Promotion from Kindergarten to Primary School**

Every child who has reached the age of six years by 31 August is obliged to attend the Primary School Grade One. A space in the Primary Department at the Swiss School in Singapore is subject to availability and the student's competency in the German or French language.

### **9.8 School Reports**

#### **Primary 1**

At the end of the school year, each student will receive a school report.

#### **Primary 2 to 6**

After the first semester, all students receive an interim report. This interim report is updated and supplemented during the second semester. At the end of each school year, all children receive a final annual report.

## **10. Academic Year**

The academic year starts from mid-August and is divided into two semesters. The first semester runs until end of January. The second semester runs from February to June.

### **10.1 Holidays**

Currently the school has the following holidays:

- 2 weeks in autumn
- 3 weeks at Christmas
- 1 week over Chinese New Year
- 2 weeks in spring
- 7 weeks in summer

There is no school during Singapore's "Public Holidays" (source: Ministry of Manpower)

### 11.1 Full Day Offer Little Tots & Playgroup I

SSiS is offering an optimal and optional Full Day Offer (FDO) for our Little Tots and Playgroup I students from Monday to Friday, from 8.30am until 3.20pm. Parents can choose between two options:

- Five full days (Monday - Friday)
- Three full days (any combination)
- Teacher/student ratio is maximum 1:5.
- Skilled Early Childhood teachers are leading this programme.
- Clean bed linen is included and will be provided by the school.
- Clean clothes for the afternoon, pyjama and possibly a personal cuddly toy will be brought from home.
- All children bring their own lunch from home, a fridge and microwave are available. The teachers are responsible for warming up the food and support/supervise the children during the lunch time.
- The fees (see appendix p. 14/15) are billed in advance before the beginning of each semester. The school fees must be paid on or before the due date.
- For students who enter or leave the school in the middle of a semester, a pro-rata payment of the fee shall be made according to point 4.

#### Withdrawal from the Full Day Offer

The SSiS needs to be informed in writing a withdrawal note no later than 3 months prior to the date of the final day of attendance.

## 11.2 Full Day Offer Playgroup II and Kindergarten

SSiS is offering an optimal and optional Full Day Offer (FDO) for our Playgroup II and Kindergarten students. This programme in German or French language runs in addition to the regular classes on Tuesday – Thursday from 1.45 until 3.20pm.

- Attendance on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday is mandatory. No individual weekdays can be chosen.
- The students have the possibility to attend the supervised Lunch Service between the morning and afternoon lessons.
- The teacher/student ratio is maximum 1:9
- Skilled native German or French-speaking teachers are leading this programme.
- The fees (see appendix p. 14/15) are billed in advance before the beginning of each semester. The school fees must be paid on or before the due date.
- For students who enter or leave the school in the middle of a semester, a pro-rata payment of the fee shall be made according to point 4.

### **Withdrawal from the Full Day Offer**

The SSiS needs to be informed in writing a withdrawal note no later than 3 months prior to the date of the final day of attendance.

## 12 Responsibility

During the school hours and the morning break, the school is responsible for the children. In addition, it is possible to register the children for free lunchtime supervision. Outside this time frame, the responsibility for the children lies with the parents.

## 13. School Meals

The Lunch Service is available from Monday to Friday to all the students from Playgroup II to P6 who either have lessons in the afternoon or attend afternoon activities in the school. Please refer to the specific information available on our [website](#). The cost of this offer is defined by the Swiss Club.

The students, however, can also bring their own food and heat it up in the microwave. They can have their lunch with the others in the Lunch Service room while being supervised by SSiS teachers and staff.

## 14. Afternoon Activities

### 14.1 Extra-Curricular Activities (ECA)

The SSiS provides Extra-Curricular Activities (ECA) on Monday to Friday afternoon. Please refer to the specific information available on our [website](#). Once the ECA enrolment is confirmed, it is compulsory for each student to complete the whole semester. There will be no refund for days absent or termination of the course. Please note that there will be a \$30 administration fee (inclusive of GST) for any late registration and any subsequent changes. The fee for each course ranges from \$300 to \$600 per semester. Each course is a weekly double lesson of 90 minutes.

#### **Applicable fees for joining/withdrawing during the semester due to relocation**

Attending less than 50% of the total weeks in a semester

- 60% of a semester course fee is applicable

Attending more than 50% of the total weeks in a semester

- 100% of a semester course fee is applicable

## 15. Insurance

The SSiS shall obtain insurance to cover third-party damage.

In the case of accident in school, parents are to claim from the private insurance for the medical expenses. If the private insurer has declined the claim, parents may approach the school with the letter from the private insurer and the medical receipts. The school will inform the parents accordingly on how to proceed with the claim.

### For all students

SSiS has obtained insurance for its students against any accident that may happen during the school hours, in the event that parents are unable to claim for such cases from their private insurance.

- Insured sum is \$50,000 per student only against death and permanent disablement.
- Insured sum is to a maximum of \$5,000 per student for medical expenses.

For more comprehensive insurance coverage, parents are advised to purchase additional coverage on their own

## 16. Illnesses/Contagious Diseases

### 16.1 Illnesses

In consideration of other students and members of the SSiS's staff, parents are advised not to send their child to the SSiS if he/she is ill.

### 16.2 Contagious Diseases

If there is a breakout of a contagious disease in a family, students should be kept at home (e.g. mumps, scarlet fever, measles, chicken pox, hand foot and mouth disease, whooping cough, diphtheria etc.).

Children who have been ill with any contagious disease must obtain a letter from their doctor certifying that they are fit to return to class.

## 17. Disciplinary Rules

### 17.1 Behaviour in the School Buildings and on the School Grounds

Polite and reasonable behaviour is expected from the students.

The Principal of the SSiS reserves the right to determine what "reasonable" behaviour is.

At SSiS, we are guided by two main principles "Integrity and Dignity" and our "Code of Conduct" seek to reinforce a secure and comfortable place for every student. The documents are available on our [website](#).

### 17.2 Damages

Parents will be liable for intentional damage of any school property caused by their child.

### 17.3 Expulsion from School

The School Committee is entitled, upon request from the Principal of SSiS, to expel any student from SSiS.

## 18. School Uniforms

All students must wear the designated SSiS uniform during official school hours. For physical education classes and excursions, all students must wear the red Swiss T-shirt. The choice of the sports pants is free.

## 19. Formal grievance procedure

A student grievance may arise from any aspect of a student's educational experience at the SSiS which they believe to be unfair, unjust or unreasonable.

A student seeking resolution of a grievance should follow the steps outlined below. These steps have been put in place to facilitate resolution of grievances with a minimum of delay.

- **Step 1:** At the onset, a student or his parent(s) should attempt to resolve the grievance informally by discussing the issue with the person responsible for the matter (the respondent). Significant effort should be placed at resolving the grievance at this level.
- **Step 2:** If feasible, all disputes should be resolved informally between the respondent and the student or his parent(s) first. If the parties cannot resolve amicably with mutual regard to the dispute involved, the student or his parent(s) may make an appointment with the Principal of the SSiS.
- **Step 3:** If the parties cannot resolve amicably with mutual regard to the dispute involved, the student or his parent(s) may send a written request to the committee of SSiS for a final resolution/decision.

In the event that the student or his parent(s) and the SSiS are unable to resolve a dispute amicably, either party can refer the dispute to the CASE Mediation Centre for mediation.

## 20. Force Majeure

In the event that SSiS is rendered unable wholly or in part to perform its obligations for any reason beyond its control, including but not limited to acts of God, strikes, civil unrest, war, riot, acts of terrorism, natural disasters, inclement weather conditions including but not limited to school closures mandated or recommended by the Ministry of Education due to haze, and any other causes of such nature, then upon in writing of such Force Majeure to the parents as soon as reasonably practicable after the occurrence of the cause relied on, SSiS shall be released from such obligations to the extent to which they are affected by the circumstances of Force Majeure and for the period during which those circumstances exist.
